Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 – Section 53 Claimed Public Right of Way at Beddingham, A26 to Red Lion Pond

When an Applicant appeals a decision by the Council not to support a Definitive Map Modification Order (DMMO) application the Applicant must do so directly to the Planning Inspectorate, along with also informing the Council of the Appeal.

Usually within a few weeks the Planning Inspectorate formally inform the Council of the Appeal and provide a reference number. At that stage the Council normally writes to the landowners and other parties to inform them of the Appeal and the reference number.

In this case the Applicant has appealed the Council's decision, but the Planning Inspectorate has not formally informed the Council despite several months having passed, possibly as a result of Covid-19. Therefore, this letter is to inform you that the Applicant has told the Council he has appealed but the Council has yet to be notified about this officially.
